

Complex Hypertension Fellowship - University of Toronto

The Division of Nephrology at the University of Toronto is accepting applications for a Fellowship in Complex Hypertension. The fellowship is based out of Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre with opportunities for clinics at Women's College Hospital.

Recently graduated nephrology trainees will have the opportunity to extend their training to enhance knowledge and experience in secondary and complex hypertension. Areas of focus and exposure will include 1) Renovascular and endocrine hypertension, 2) hypertension and kidney disease in pregnancy, 3) blood pressure measurement (remote home blood pressure monitoring, ambulatory blood pressure monitoring), 4) hypertension in patients with chronic kidney disease, 5) renal nerve denervation.

Participation in scholarly activity and medical education throughout the fellowship is strongly recommended and will be supported. Fluency in English is required. The applicant must have completed clinical training in nephrology, passed or be eligible for independent licensure in Ontario, or must be eligible for an education license (minimum of 4 years of residency training following medical school). Outstanding applicants with equivalent training in other medical systems are also encouraged to apply, but preference may be given to Canadian applicants. Salary will be approximately \$78,000 CDN per annum.

The starting date is in Summer 2025, and the duration is 1 year. Interested individuals should provide their current curriculum vitae, a personal statement about their career goals in relation to the fellowship and contact information of three potential referees, by November 1, 2024.
