The Department of Medicine, Dalhousie University / Nova Scotia Health, seeks applications for a Nephrologist in the Division of Nephrology at the QEII Health Sciences Centre, Halifax, Nova Scotia.

The Division of Nephrology is one of 15 divisions within the Department of Medicine and is a leader of tertiary clinical services in the Atlantic Provinces. In addition to playing an important clinical role in the Department, division members have excellent opportunities for collaborative educational and research activities to facilitate rewarding and fulfilling career development.

The Division of Nephrology, Dalhousie University/Central Zone Nova Scotia Health is seeking an academic nephrologist with additional subspeciality training in Kidney Transplantation. Training in another subspecialty area would be considered an additional strength.

This position will be a major clinical appointment with periodic review and will include an appointment at the appropriate academic rank in the Dalhousie University Department of Medicine, based on qualifications and experience.

The position will commence on or after July 1, 2025. The successful applicant will focus their clinical activity in kidney transplantation, with other clinical activity in general nephrology. They will also be expected to participate in the provision of patient care in the setting of in centre and satellite dialysis, inpatient nephrology care and ambulatory kidney care. Teaching in nephrology and internal medicine with undergraduate and postgraduate students is expected. The Division of Nephrology has established interests in clinical research and the applicant will be expected to support the research initiatives of the division.

Candidates must hold FRCPC (or equivalent) certification in Internal Medicine and subspecialty certification in Nephrology. Recognized fellowship training in transplantation is also required. Candidates must be eligible for specialty licensure in Nova Scotia.

The Department of Medicine is committed to fostering a collegial culture grounded in equity, diversity, and inclusiveness. Nova Scotia offers exceptional cultural and recreational opportunities in addition to an outstanding quality of life in all domains. All

qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
